The teacher wants to use collaborative learning with her online students who are accessing the e-learning from a variety of locations, including their homes and their neighborhood schools.</p> <p>What differences will the teacher have to keep in mind when designing collaboration for her online students? [x]	<p>Whether collaboration will happen in real-time or asynchronously</p> <p>That is right. In an e-learning environment collaboration can take place synchronously or asynchronously depending on the design. This is not a concern in face-to-face environments because teacher and students are all in the same room.</p>
[x]	<p>How much information to include in the e-learning experience</p> <p>That is right. In face-to-face environments, the teacher often presents a lot of information to students. If a teacher opts for the information-dump type of presentation in an e-learning environment, students are likely to disengage due to a lack of support.</p>
[x]	<p>Which types of multimedia to use in the e-learning experience</p> <p>That is right. While face-to-face environments usually rely on one mode of presentation, well-designed e-learning incorporates multiple means of presentation, including audio, video, and text.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>What kind of homework to assign students</p> <p>Try again. Homework assignments are a part of both e-learning and face-to-face learning environments.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>How much control students are given over their learning</p> <p>Try again. The amount of student control over their own learning is a part of both e-learning and face-to-face learning environments.</p>
