[x]	Whether collaboration will happen in real-time or asynchronously That is right. In an e-learning environment collaboration can take place synchronously or asynchronously depending on the design. This is not a concern in face-to-face environments because teacher and students are all in the same room.
[x]	How much information to include in the e-learning experience That is right. In face-to-face environments, the teacher often presents a lot of information to students. If a teacher opts for the information-dump type of presentation in an e-learning environment, students are likely to disengage due to a lack of support.
[x]	Which types of multimedia to use in the e-learning experience That is right. While face-to-face environments usually rely on one mode of presentation, well-designed e-learning incorporates multiple means of presentation, including audio, video, and text.
[]	What kind of homework to assign students Try again. Homework assignments are a part of both e-learning and face-to-face learning environments.
0	How much control students are given over their learning Try again. The amount of student control over their own learning is a part of both e-learning and face-to-face learning environments.
