
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You're all grown up and ready for your first apartment.

Here are a few things to consider before you make your big move.



How Much Can You Afford?

Create a budget so you know exactly where your money is going and how much you can afford.


Rent should take up no more than 30% of your income.

Other essentials, such as groceries, should make up about 20% of your income.

Entertainment, gym memberships, and eating out should account for no more than 25% of your income.

The remaining **25% of your income** should be earmarked for savings, paying down debt, and meeting other **financial goals**.





What Are You Responsible For?



Before you sign a lease, read it carefully and find out if you are responsible for paying:

- Utilities, including heat and electricity
- Water, sewer and/or trash
- Snow removal and/or lawnmowing
- Parking
- Internet
- Cable
- Renter's insurance
- Common room fees

What Do You Need?

If you're moving out on your own, you're going to need supplies.

To save money, try to get second-hand items or buy a little bit each week until you have everything.

At the minimum you will need:

- Kitchen supplies (pots and pans, silverware, cups, plates, bowls, dish soap, dish scrubber, kitchen towels, vacuum, mop, broom, dustpan)
- Bathroom supplies (towels, cleaning supplies)
- Bedroom (bed, dresser, mirror, sheets, blanket, pillow, hangers)
- Other furniture (table, couch, chairs)
- Laundry supplies (detergent, laundry basket, quarters)
